### DOCKS COMMITTEE

The June work party focused upon reworking downspouts on Dock 2 to accommodate the new draft curtains, already in progress. Considerable retired phone wire was also removed and numerous small tasks were accomplished or progressed. Thanks this month go to: John Alving, Dave Svendsen, V/C George Austin, Bob Prestebak, Jeff Purvis, P/C Carl Weiss, Andy Foster, Dave Armstrong, Steve Hanson, Art Mauldin, and Dan Wilshin. If this list is incomplete, you have my apologies.

It's June 14 and the Fire Code required draft curtain project is 33% complete. The function of these wooden "curtains" is to contain the heated gases and smoke from any fire and to inhibit the flow of air and heated gases horizontally beneath the roofs. The requirement is that the contained area be no more than 2000 square feet or two vessels. Plywood was chosen as the easiest material to cut, fit, and nail in place with conventional tools and only reasonably skilled labor. It also appeared to be the most cost effective material available.

The plywood chosen and approved for this use is not conventional plywood. Its fire retardant treatment causes the wood to char and become self protecting against fire. Its ability to sustain combustion and spread flame is nearly equivalent to gypsum board. The performance of this material is truly remarkable and surprised the Fire Marshal's people. They were not sure how this requirement would be realistically achieved until our people found this nearly perfect solution. Thanks, John Alving.

The curtain assemblies will likely last as long as the roofs remain standing and may also outlive the fuels feeding the fire. Draft curtains work in conjunction with the smoke vents now scheduled to be installed in 2012 and 2013 and with the fire breaks which must remain clear of materials over 7 feet high.

Projects for this summer should include some painting, small wood work repairs, and dock planking. A new lumber storage rack at the shore end of Dock 3 is in the planning stage and we're hoping to get the cleat project in progress. Some re-work of our lighting is needed to accommodate the new draft curtains. Several other items

need our attention while the weather is decent. This fall, the Docks Committee needs to put in place an improved Dock Captain program. Dock Captains will be a closer liaison between mooring members and the committee.

Work parties are scheduled for August 14 and September 11. Committee meetings are scheduled on Tuesdays July 27, August 24, and September 28. Normal work parties commence at 8:30AM and meetings are at 6:00PM.

## REGATTA POWER REPORT

### EZ Picken's Race, Apr 24th

Bremerton and Port Orchard YC's teamed up once again to sponsor the EZ Picken's Race, starting at BYC and traveling to POYC.

A day with sunny skies and 20 knot south winds still made for another enjoyable ride for the 15 racers. The race went from BYC through Port Washington Narrows, up to University Pt and back to POYC. There were pot luck appetizers at BYC and the great POYC Steak Fry dinner on Saturday.

First Overall went to POYC's Fred Cole on *Mousetrap*. Second and third went to BYC's Bill Rumbold and Jim Vanantwerp. Bob Lindal on *Suzy Q* was seventh.

### Poulsbo YC, Liberty Bay Challenge, May 15

The gorgeous weather made this a special treat for the 12 racers who braved the crowds of the VikingFest weekend in Poulsbo. Poulsbo YC had 5 racers.

Bob and Sue Lindal and P/C Jeff Ewell on *Suzy Q* won with a score of

0.8657%, repeating their win last year. Dick Timmerman on *Vagabond* came in second with a score of 0.9216%. Jim Korzetz of PYC on *Freedom* was third at 1.2525%.

Andy Gerde on *Windy-i* was sixth overall and second in Class 1 and Dave Padgett on *Slipaway* was seventh and second in class 2.

### Capital to Capital Leg One 2010 Olympia to Narrows May 28<sup>th</sup>

The usual Filucy Bay race in early June was switched to this date to accommodate the 15 racers presently on the Great Race to Alaska. The Alaska Race was first run in June, 1928, and the 10 boats ran day and night for a week starting in Olympia and ending in Juneau. The Capital to Capital Leg One 2010 race was intended to replicate the first leg of the Great Alaska Race.

The 10 boat fleet started (including a few boats who only ran this leg and without a few Alaska bound boats who joined in Bedwell or Nanaimo) in rain and poor visibility at the Olympia Shoal light, flying all their dress colors and with a committee boat from Olympia YC taking photos. The 4 leg race ended at the Narrows Bridge with the large EBB producing 5 knots of help.

Fred Cole on *Mousetrap* won his second race in a month with a score 1.1338%. P/C Dick Timmerman on *Vagabond* was second with 1.1618% and IPBA Commodore Jim Anderson of GHYC on *Fidalgo* was third at 1.8954%.

Bob Lindal on *Suzy Q* was fourth overall and first in Class 3 with 2.0005%. Bill Anderson on *The Tillie* was seventh and second in class 3 with 2.8626%. Andy Gerde and Kent

Soffel on *Windy-i* were eighth and second in class 2 with 3.1938%. Tom Roth on *Bird of Paradise* was ninth and third in class 3 with 4.805%.

### International Cruiser Race, May 31st

The ICR is usually run during July in the San Juans or Gulf Islands; but in keeping with the Capital to Capital theme, the ICR was moved to Memorial Day to allow the Alaska bound skippers to compete. As this is the premier race of the year, 8 legs and 38 nm, it is broken into 2 races and counts as double plus 0.25 (2.25x) in the annual points scoring using the combined scores in the 2 races.

Fifteen racers competed in the foggy, rainy weather, so typical of Memorial Day. Several skippers had such poor visibility when crossing the ferry routes they used their radar for safety reasons. Recent rule changes now allow radar in safety situations; however, as no advantage can be gained, the results for that leg are not used in the

skipper's score calculations.

The race followed the Capital to Capital route, starting at Bedwell Harbor, BC, and ran through Navy and Trincomali Channels and along the east side of Thetis and Kuper Islands to just before Dodd Narrows. The fleet then rendezvoused at Nanaimo YC for the Awards peel off for both the C to C and ICR races.

First Overall went to Bob and Sue Lindal on *Suzy Q* with a score of 1.4670%. Andy Gerde and Kent Soffel on *Windy-i* were second with 1.7515% and also won the Novice award. Third went to BYC's Owen Ritter on *Outbound* with 1.9167%.

Ken Klett on *Klettitat* was fifth with 2.1785%. Bill Anderson on *The Tillie* was twelfth with 2.9612%. P/C Dick Timmerman on *Vagabond* was thirteenth with 3.2771%.

All the QCYC boats except *Suzy Q* continued on to Alaska.

The next race is the SYC Stimson on Sept 18<sup>th</sup> and the POYC Fall Round Up on Oct 9<sup>th</sup>.




