## VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

**T** rue to form, Opening Day was once again a huge success. One of the crowning accomplishments was that Captains Michele & Dave Bedner and their entire crew on *Merleau* were selected by the Opening Day judges as number #1, first place in their class competition. What a nice prize to bring back to QCYC. Thank you and congratulations to all of you! Of course we thank “Thor” for staying home and allowing the near perfect weather for Saturday and Sunday

Opening Day at Queen City offered us plenty of good food, spirits and two nights of dancing on Friday and Saturday evenings. And, of course one of the most enjoyable aspects was all the good fellowship and enjoyment between club members, friends and guests. What a nice way to begin our boating season.

### DOCKS:

We continue to make good progress on our docks projects. Waterfront Construction is busy completing the Queen City permit application for the Dock #1 extension. The submission will be ready to go to the DNR folks on or before July, 2012.

The Queen City Junior Boating program has agreed to share in the cost of the purchase of a used 24" X 12 ft. aluminum access ramp with double side hand rails. The new access ramp will be permanently installed at the small access door opening off the east wall of the covered moorage on Dock #3. This will provide a permanent means and easy access to the (75) foot long movable dock used by the Junior Boating program activities during the summer. In the off season the aluminum ramp will be raised to a vertical position and secured and locked into place. Kudos to Capt. Pat Dore for taking the lead on this task.

Work on the new sewage pump-out station to be located near the dinghy haul-out crane at the “U-Dock” should get under way by the first or second week of June. Please plan on limited parking during the trenching work and repaving operation in the east parking lot area. We anticipate the disruption to last approximately a week and half and no longer than 10 days.

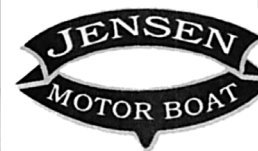

### POULSBO YC – LIBERTY BAY CHALLENGE

A pleasant day with 5 to 10 kn north winds and a short 15 nm course made for an enjoyable race. The course started just south of Keyport and went to Rich Passage and back through Liberty Bay to the Poulsbo YC South Dock. 18 racers competed.

On Saturday, April 21, Bremerton Yacht Club and Port Orchard Yacht Club jointly hosted the Easy Pickins' in West Sound Navigation Contest. ### OUTSTATION REPORT

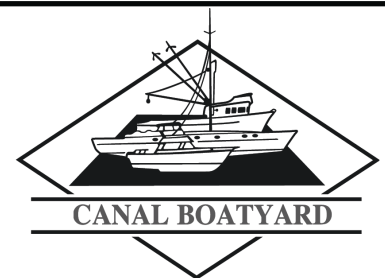

Some preparations for a reconfiguration of the junior club's summer program floats were also done. The goal of this rearrangement is to make better and more reliable facilities available for the junior activities, to free up Work Float #1 and to free two slips for long term assignment without interfering with the junior activities. Big thanks to: Jim Mcfadden, Pete Collins, Pat Dore, Don Wilson, Ron Stevenson and Chuck Gould.

Advance work is underway for the big job of installing the required smoke vents in the flat roofs. Queen City Yacht Club has now received written notice of compliance with all provisions of Chapter 94 extensions to the Seattle Fire Code, except that the smoke vents are still outstanding. The club should be

very proud of itself for stepping to the front of the pack in proactively working toward property protection advancements, to increase personnel safety for our members and guests and to give fire fighters adequate tools and a relatively safe working environment for them to fight for us in the event that we do suffer a fire. We've done a great deal to make their job possible here and to reduce our possible losses. We have done a very large job and it's been planned, and executed with volunteer efforts. We do the word "volunteer" proud at Queen City! Don't let anyone tell you otherwise.

The April 25 general meeting featured a presentation about this club's status and efforts in regard to compliance with chapter 94, which is new fire code exclusively addressed to marina covered moorage, which was adopted as city ordinance in May of 2005. We'll try to make that presentation more available to you. It answered a lot of your questions.

June 9<sup>th</sup> will be the Tarette garage sale. Diane Prestebak is our chairman.

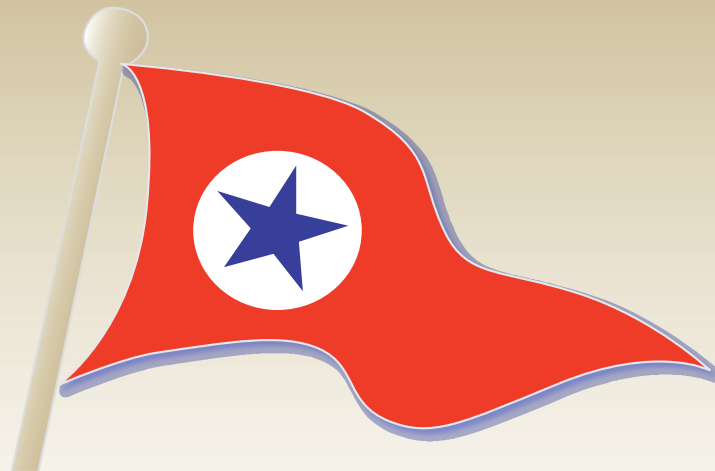

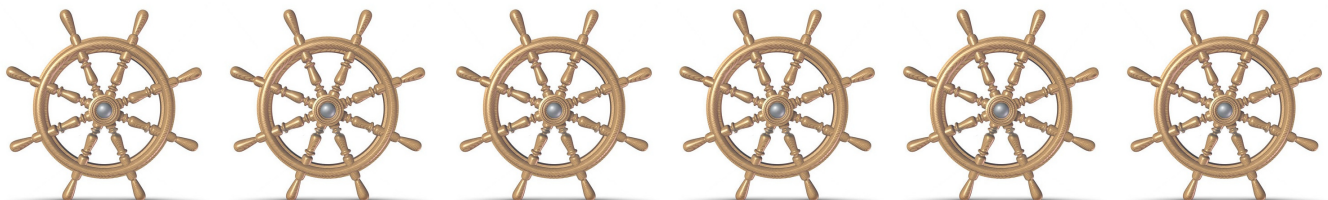

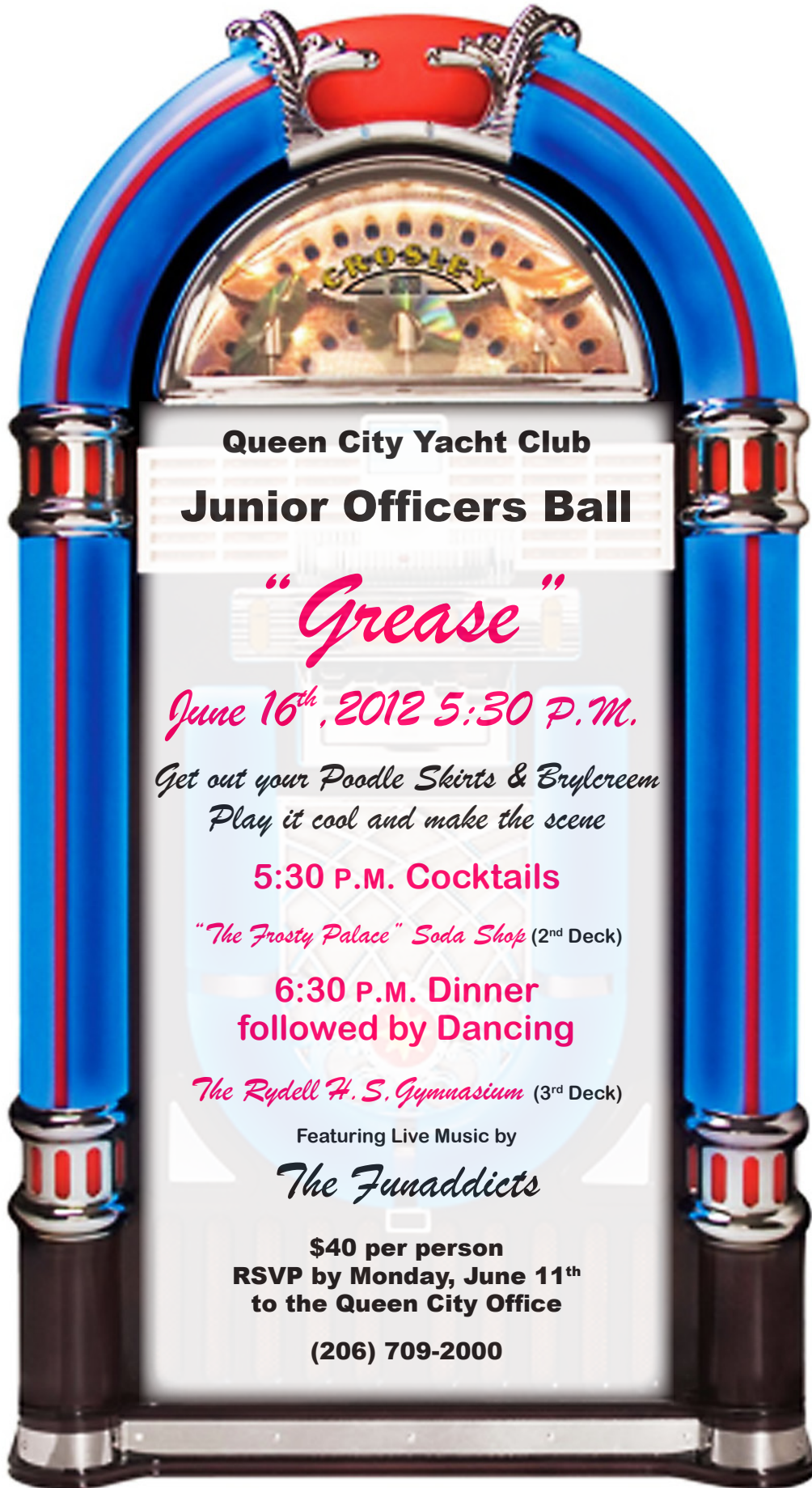
