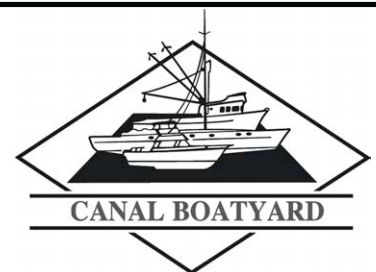

DOCKS DOIN'S

PRESSURE WASHING:

Please be very reluctant to use a pressure washer on the wood plank sections of our docks.

The high pressure spray digs out the "pith," or soft portion of the wood. This creates valleys on

the surface of the plank where standing water can accumulate. Standing water accelerates rot. A lot of our dock planks are pressure treated, and the rot resistant chemicals are concentrated on the exterior surfaces of the plank. We can literally "blast off" the protection with aggressive pressure washing.

Just last Saturday we replaced some planks out on Dock One. Based on the dramatic change in color on the finger pier, it looked like one of our members had used a pressure washer to clean his boat and then went about halfway out the finger pier. The planks we had to replace were in far worse condition where they had been pressure washed than in the sections where the pressure washer had not been used.

What's not to like about a power tool that sprays water all over and makes a lot of noise? It's easy to understand why people like to pressure wash, but please be very reluctant to use them, at all, on our dock planks.

HOUSE COMMITTEE

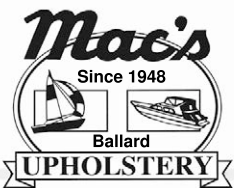
The House installed a new water fountain on the second floor with cold running water.

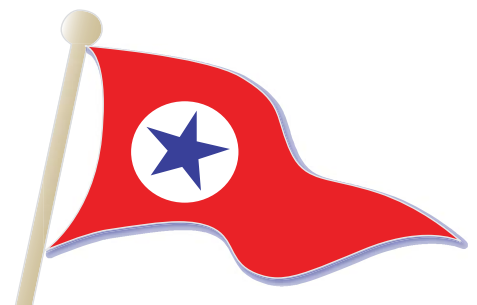
Our membership count is 374 active members, 110 life members, 9 social members, and 7 pending applicants waiting to be inducted.

If you have an interest in helping with the Membership Committee, contact myself or Rear Commodore John Rogers. We appreciate all your ideas and considerations for Membership.

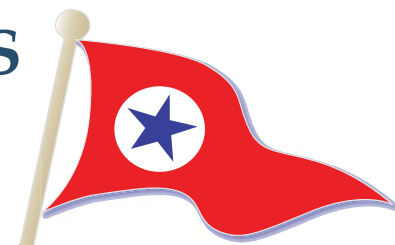
