Club Rules otherwise incomplete. Each member in this category will be receiving a letter please excuse the fact that it will be a form letter which will identify the noted deficiency. We are certain that with few exceptions, these issues can be quickly and painlessly cleared up. Every pleasure boat in Washington is required to be registered as such with the Department of Licensing and its owner receives a certificate from that agency; that is the registration we are looking for. A Coast Guard issued Document is not proof of registration for moorage purposes; nor is a Department of Revenue certificate. Proof of insurance showing the correct limits (\$500,000) and naming QCYC as additional insured is required. You can usually get such proof sent to the Club by your insurance agent.

### Official Measurement

Each member is reminded that since 2004, the measurement process has changed. If you were measured before 2004 you will have to be remeasured to be considered for any moorage move or assignment.

#### Docks

A recent survey of the docks for insurance has turned up a number of privately installed electrical systems. Private installations of any equipment and private alteration of any Club facility is not only unauthorized but can present a hazard to the facility. Besides, it's not being a good member.

Mooring Members, if you want to use a doormat on the dock, please use one that breaths so that the decking beneath does not rot.

The pile cap project is finished and again thanks to every member whose boat had to be moved during the work. Your cooperation kept that work on time and saved the Club money. Thanks again to Tom Youngs his many hours at the Club on this project. The minor wiring project on a section of Dock 2 should be completed by now.

#### **Outstations**

There is an outstation work party scheduled for April 21. Outstation Chairs Barb and Eric Wood should have an exciting agenda set. Your participation is not only vital, but it is such a good way to meet people and it's a good time for all. You do not have to have specific skills and you do not need to come by boat.



## OUTSTATIONS AWAIT QUEEN CITY CRUISERS

Queen City members have three outstations for member use. Available for our members are facilities on Bainbridge Island, Ganges Marina on Salt Spring Island in the Canadian Gulf Islands, and Deer Harbor Marina on Orcas Island in the San Juan Islands. Following are items of information on the Ganges and Deer Harbor facilities.

At Ganges, we have entered into a renewed two-year lease for 140' of continuous dock space on dock "C". The space accommodates rafting of boats, and we are able to raft out two boats to the third boat on the dock, space and vessel safety permitting. Power and water are available.

To access the Queen City space, members would go around the north end of the breakwater, which is dock "D" and proceed ahead. Our space is on the right, on dock "C" and will have signage on the fascia board above the waterline, and a tie-up rail that will be painted red to mark our space. A nice aspect of our space is that the pilings and piling rings are on the opposite side of the dock from the Queen City space.

The same rules for our members apply at Ganges as at Deer Harbor. They can be found on page 116 of our current annual. Members need to sign-in at the office and fly their burgee. You can access the marina web-site at...

www.gangesmarina.com

Ganges is a great spot to shop for provisions, and is an area that has a big arts community. On the weekends there is a farmer's market, a very short walk from the marina. The marina is in the heart of Ganges, and is a popular addition to our outstations.

Deer Harbor Marina on Orcas Island was acquired by the Bellport Group two years ago from Craig Webster. The new marina manager is Marc Broman who is anxious to make sure our relationship remains an excellent one. Our lease, just renewed, runs through April of 2012. The Queen City space is 130' of continuous dock on the outside tie-up of dock "D", which is on the south side, or entering side of the marina. Our members need to signin and fly their burgee when using the Queen City space. The area is marked with signage, on the fascia board above the waterline. A new arrangement in our lease is that during the winter months, we will use fifty-foot finger pier docks on dock "D". During the winter, they sometimes have to tie big boats up on the outside area that we normally occupy. It should make it safer and more comfortable during the winter months for our club members.



In our assigned summer area, they ask that our members be careful to insure that we don't tie-up and hang over into the passageway that boats use to enter the marina. It can be a problem if we are not careful, and we put our boats at unnecessary risk of being hit by other boats.

#### RADAR ON OFFENSE AND DEFENSE

Like to learn more about your RADAR?

The Seattle Sail and Power Squadron is presenting an evening

seminar using a computer simulator to see what radar screens look like and how the targets move with each sweep. It requires practice to understand what it is telling you, and what it cannot tell you.

On offense, the objective is to not be surprised when the 18 knot ferry pops out of the fog ½ mile away: basic techniques to use your radar to avoid other boats navigate in tight quarters and anchor.

On defense, realize that commercial boats use radar in good weather and bad, with automatic target trackers. There will be a few simple tips for making their radar work for your benefit.

When buying a radar, the specifications can be pretty overwhelming (incidentally "36 mile" is not a useful spec). The seminar will review the important tradeoffs in resolution, power, displays, signal processing, mounting, networks and accessories.

Okay, you've never made homemade bread and think it's too much work. Or, you used to make bread all the time but haven't done it in years. This recipe is easy, fail-proof, and so much better than anything at the grocery store. It's from an old Betty Crocker cookbook my mother-in-law gave me when Bob and I were newlyweds. I hadn't made this bread in several years and baked some last weekend to go with homemade soup. I had forgotten how easy and good it is. Buy some yeast to have on hand, then spend the next rainy weekend afternoon baking this heavenly bread. There's nothing like it!

## Homemade White Bread

2 packages dry yeast 3/4 cup warm water 2 2/3 cups warm water (baby bath warm) ¼ cup sugar 1 tbl salt 3 tbls shortening

9 to 10 cups unbleached, all purpose flour
Soft butter

Dissolve yeast in 3/4 cup warm water. Stir in 2 2/3 cups warm water, the sugar, salt, shortening and 5 cups of the flour. Beat with a spoon until smooth. Mix in enough of the remaining flour to make the dough easy to handle.

Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface. Knead until smooth and elastic, about 10 minutes, adding more flour as needed. Place in greased bowl, turn greased side up. Cover with a clean dish towel, put in a warm place to rise until double (1 hour is plenty).

Punch dough down, divide in half. With your hands, push each piece of dough into a rectangle about 8 X 18 inches. Beginning at the short side,

roll up into a loaf.
Place seam side down
in a greased loaf pan.
Brush lightly with
butter, place in a warm
place to rise until double
(1 hour).

Cooky's Corner

Heat oven to 425 degrees. Place loaves in center of oven and bake for 30 to 35 minutes until deep golden brown. Remove from pans and cool on wire rack. Makes two loaves.






