We will not start digging until we're sure of dry weather for 2 weeks, so this is looking like mid-

We're moving along on the required projects for the Fire Compliance Project and next up is to start working on draft curtains. These are wood dividers that will help direct fire and smoke out the ends of the covered moorage roofs if we were to have an incident. John Alving has a couple of them up on Dock One if you want to see them. Please give John or Art a few hours, as the more hands we have the quicker this will be completed. If we don't do this with our own labor we will have to pay to get it done.

You will see some new signs on the docks about swimming. There have been some verified deaths from swimming in marinas with stray electrical current shocking people. See this link:

Mysteries and daffodils are on the horizon for QCYC cruisers.


Last year's Mystery Cruise was so successful that Commodore Ed Jennerich especially wanted us to do it again this year, and we are, on March 20-21:





DOCKS COMMITTEE

Focus: Draft Curtains Project

The February 13 work party was another success. We did a few small tasks, but mostly we were absorbed with de-commissioning the old standpipes on Docks 1 and 2. The pipes themselves still need to be removed, but now we have satisfied the requirements for out of service systems. Thanks to Pete Collins, Dave Svendsen, Jim McFadden, Mark Pywell, Richard Thymian, Dick McGrew, Art Mauldin, and to last month's winners of the "Forgotten Laborer's Cup," Tim and Nadeane Rutledge for their efforts in January.

March should see a genuine beginning to progress with our firecode-required draft curtain project. This task is a simple one requiring a fairly small investment for materials and tools. While there is a lot of work to be accomplished, it is work that doesn't require a lot of special expertise. It fits us and it is the one large project on the list where member labor can save us the most of our precious treasury. The Docks Committee has pursued a quote for the job done by a contractor. Ask about that price if you wonder about the worth of member labor and how it can make our yacht club thrive and even survive.

The draft curtains project is expected to spin off from the Docks Committee and to largely stand alone. It will function as a subcommittee that sets its own work schedules, goals, and procedures. We have about 5 plus years remaining to satisfy the least stringent requirements of Chapter 94, but this project should progress as fast as members feel like making it go. If we complete it soon enough, the same functioning work force

may be able to save us considerable resources when we start installing the required smoke vents, but not if the draft curtains remain incomplete. Dick Dow, Steve Weiss, John Alving, and Ron Stevenson can use your help!

Please do understand that there remain a lot of other, smaller tasks that must proceed alongside this and other projects. If there is not enough labor for both, it might be necessary that the big project be given over to contract methods as the smaller tasks are even more expensive to manage and hire out. Everything here is a very delicate balancing game and every minute of volunteer effort makes the balance a little easier to achieve.

Our next work parties are March 13 and April 10 (Second Saturdays) at 8:30 AM. We try to wrap it up by 3:30 after a club provided lunch at about noon. The next Docks Committee meetings are scheduled for 6:00 PM Feb. 23 and March 23. Committee meetings are held on the fourth Tuesday of every month.

Action of the Board of Directors at its February meeting has imposed rule No. 2.17, prohibiting swimming at the in-station marina. This action has been taken in response to new information about the hazards of electricity at fresh water marinas. I



Queen City Junior Yacht Club 2010 Boating and Sailing Camps

The Queen City Junior Yacht Club is now looking for eager young people for the 2010 summer boating and sailing camps. Campers must be able to swim and should be between the ages of 9 and 17. The 2010 sessions will begin the week of June 21st and run through the week of August 16. Each will be one week long, Mondays through Fridays, from 9:00AM to 3:00PM..

Members can sign up their kids or grandkids on Saturday, April 3rd, and be first in line for the week(s) you prefer, from 10:00AM to noon at the clubhouse, second floor.

Instruction for both beginning and intermediate level boaters is provided by certified sailing Instructors. Curriculum includes boating safety, small boat handling, rowing and sailing fundamentals, knots, and more. The fleet consists of 8 sailboats and 4 kayaks. The primary focus is to have students learn about boating and sailing while having a really good time. The objective is to have the initial boating experience be a fun one.

QCJYC provides course materials and the use of lifejackets. Students need to bring their own lunches and towels. Tuition is \$300 per week with a discount for the same student taking a second week or for a second student in the same family. Registration information is available on the Queen City website.


