Recently I received an email from Puget Soundkeeper Alliance asking about Queen City's progress in the Best Management Practices (BMP) to gain full Clean Marina Certification designation. Our review of the BMP raised several objections and reservations for going forward with the BMP certification process. The BMP as written allows for too much monitoring and/or inspection of a private ownership club like Queen City by the Soundkeeper Alliance. I sent an email letter declining QCYC's participation in the BMP certification.


Book: *Sins of the Father* by Jeffrey Archer

### **TARETTE ARCHIVES**

The process of organizing Tarette historical documents has begun.
