We have made additional provisions for the collection and disposal of food waste, but for it to be successful, we need the cooperation and compliance by our members to make this work effectively. While this change may be viewed as inconvenient and troublesome

by some, it's the right thing to do; and once we all adjust to the new requirements, it will fall in line with recycling bottles, cans and cardboard.

The good news is the food waste can be combined with yard waste and we have arranged for a new dumpster to be available for that purpose. This change not only affects the food waste that is generated from the clubhouse, but also from your boats, so we will all need to make provisions accordingly.

The City of Seattle plans to enforce their requirement by assessing a \$50 fine if a significant amount of recyclables or compostable material is found in commercial garbage. The good news is the fines will not become effective until July 1, 2015, so we all have time to adjust to the new requirement, and for the club and individuals to make the necessary provisions for compliance.
