## COMMODORE'S REPORT

JANUARY 2014

**H**appy New Year to you!

We feel like a New Year is a chance to reset the course and adjust the compass back to true north.

As we focus and set the course for the New Year ahead, my sight is set to navigate our club's resounding vote to initiate a comprehensive upgrade and replacement of the Portage Bay Main Station Marina electrical system. The mail in ballot results were announced by By-law Chair Scott Grimm at the December 11, 2013, general meeting, passing with an 86% margin: 201 YES to 33 NO votes. This vote is the culmination of several years of discussion and work-arounds related to voltage irregularity, stray current and fire concerns aptly assessed by the Electrical Project Committee led by Captain John Alving.

The second phase of this project will be to ascertain funding per Treasurer Jan Gould, who reports that Umpqua Bank leads the lender institutions with the most favorable commercial loan package of \$1.3 million.

Phase three will be the formal bidding process.

Currently seven contractors will meet, conduct a site walkthrough and complete an initial overview of the project with John Alving's team, which will then present a review and recommendations based on these bids to the Board of Trustees, Bridge and Planning & Finance Committee. This project is expected to take several months to complete.

There are no easy answers but there are simple answers. We must have the courage to do what we know is right. I am convinced that we have

made a courageous decision for our club's future and generations to come.

Of equal importance in 2014, QCYC will need to maintain our fiscal viability and revenues, by increasing our membership base and developing new membership products that will deepen the volunteer pool of people, talent and skill.

To accomplish this goal we will implement a By-law change allowing the Board of Trustees discretion to enhance initiation incentives. To that end we have kicked off a reduced membership fee campaign that offers a \$1,500 Boat Show Special. This is a fantastic deal. Call your boating friends and invite them to join up! We anticipate a great response at the Seattle Boat Show, which runs January 24 to

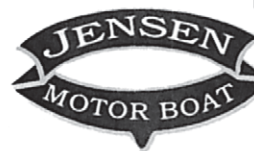

## DOCKS DOIN'S

**T**hanks to everybody who participated in Docks Fun Day in December. What an amazing turnout! We got a surprising amount accomplished, including a number of small projects as well as replacing a couple of hundred feet of decaying planks.

The next Docks Committee meeting will be January 7, 6:30, at QCYC.

The next Docks Fun Day will be Saturday, January 11, beginning with a free breakfast at 8:30.

During 2014, we're going to be replacing some of the loosest cleats in the marina. Our new process will include putting a section of tropical hardwood planking under the cleats. The cleats will be more firmly attached than before, and the tropical hardwood will last much longer than the pressure treated fir commonly used for dock planks. The longer lifespan of the tropical hardwood will reduce the number of times a cleat will need to be removed and reinstalled because the plank underneath has gone rotten.

### PREDICTED LOG RACING CLASSES

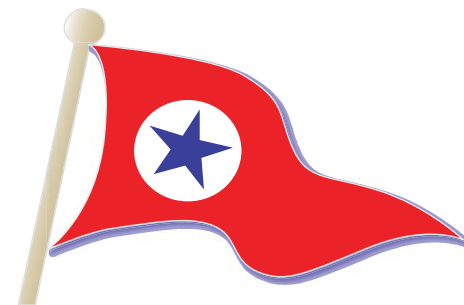
