#### TO RECAP A BUSY APRIL:



Docks co-chair, Ron Stevenson, recently snapped a couple of photos while walking the docks. We present them here to "spark" some consideration for recommended practices when connecting to shore power in the marina. The first photo, "Don't do this," is so absurd that it really ought to be funny- but it isn't. A look around the marina will reveal any number of electrical hook-ups just about this bad. Loose cords, draped any which way or, as in this case, wound around the same rack as the washdown hose, will get tripped over or jerked around when handling. If the shore power connector is not well secured to the outlet, moving the cord can create a gap between the contacts.

Most marina fires begin with an electrical problem, and arcing and sparking at loose shore power connections can turn into a multimillion dollar disaster.

In the "Don't do this" photo, the weight of the shore power cord tends to pull the connector out of the socket.

Ron's "Do this" photo is a good example of a proper shore power hookup. The cord has been secured in such a manner that there is no weight pulling the connector away from the socket. The plastic ring has been screwed onto the fitting to additionally secure the shore power connection and ensure a tight fit that reduces electrical resistance and eliminates sparks. Not all of our electrical connections will accommodate a plastic ring, but if your slip has the capability please consider using it. Buying a plastic ring is much cheaper than replacing a burned out shore power cord, not to mention replacing an entire boat and dealing with the financial consequences of a disastrous fire.

#### **REGATTA POWER REPORT**

The Tacoma YC Jack Hyde Memorial Race on March 22nd was held at TYC's main station after being held last year at their Wollochet Bay Out-Station for the first time ever. Again reemphasizing that the ONLY way to be invited to the out-stations of the Grand 14 without going through the bridge chairs is to be a log racer. The cadets from Curtis High School's Naval Junior ROTC group were observers.

The warm spring day with calm winds and seas contrasted with the usual swirling currents. The course ran from the club up Quartermaster Harbor and across Colvos to Gig Harbor and Pt Evans, returning around Pt Defiance to the club.

Four racers bested 1% in the field of 21 Racers. POYC/GHYC's Fred Cole on *Mousetrap* with 0.7630% won. Bob Lindal and P/C Jeff Ewell on *Suzy Q* were second with 0.7898%. John Murphey on *Sturdy Gal* was third with 0.8216%. Ken Klett and Marv Elbon with 1.7014% on *Klettitat* were sixth overall and second in class 5.

#### SEAHAWKS HARBOR RACE – April 5th

The Eagle Harbor Invitational Race was renamed in honor of the Seahawk's Superbowl win - The Seahawks Harbor Race or simply Hawk's Harbor Race. It was held on the weekend of April 5, 6 and 7 at our Winslow outstation. The QCYC race team and other QCYC members pitched in and with the help and financial support of the SYC race team we put on a tremendous weekend of boating. The combination of SYC and QCYC has made this a premier event of the IPBA season and one of the largest events at our outstation. We hosted 25 boats from eight clubs.

Our outstation was as busy as a summer holiday weekend club event with over 30 boats including other club members and the racers – and as usual we accommodated everyone comfortably. QCYC members handled most of the social events and SYC took care of most of the race functions and the Friday night dinner. Ken Klett and Marv Elbon handled Saturday night and P/C's Dick Timmerman and Bill Anderson prepared their usual great omelets on Sunday morning. Vince Firlotte was in charge of arranging the observers.

The predicted 25 kn winds only got to 15 but it sure messed up the racers who had a FIXED THROTTLE leg of the final leg — #6. There were two very good scores with over double for the remainder. The course ran from Yeomalt Point through a sailboat race with 100 sailboats past Blakely Rock, around Blake Is and up to through Rich Passage buoy R4 and back to Blakely Rock.

First overall went to Todd Prodzinski and Bill Grady of SYC on *Zorro* with 0.5939%. Bob Lindal and P/C Jeff Ewell on *Suzy Q* took second with a 0.6056% –less than one second behind. GHYC's Jim Anderson on *Fidalgo* – took third with 1.4546%.

QCYC won the Team Trophy with Marv Elbon and Ken Klett, Bill Anderson and Dave Padgett and Vince Firlotte joining Bob and Jeff for the best team.

QCYC racers won lots of Class awards as well. Ken Klett and



Marv Elbon were first in class 5 with 1.6554% and 5th overall. Dave Padgett on *Slipaway* was first in class 4 and seventh overall with 1.7785%. Bill Anderson on *The Tillie* was 16th overall with 1.6310%. Pat Baker and Phil Tenning on *Choppers* were 19th overall with 2.4022%. John Rogers on *Nirvana* was 23rd with 2.5618%. Bruce Cullen on *Caroline* was second in class 3 and 18th overall with 2.3462%.

#### EZ PICKIN'S - BYC to POYC

On Saturday, April 26, Bremerton Yacht Club and Port Orchard Yacht Club jointly hosted the EZ Pickin's in West Sound Navigation Contest. April weather couldn't have been better for the afternoon challenge that took 13 contestants from BYC up around Dyes Inlet, then down the Port Washington Narrows and up Port Orchard to Illahee, back south to downtown Bremerton, with the awards banquet held at POYC. The weather was sunny, waters with a little chop and 10 kn south winds but with 3.0 kn predicted in the long



run down the Narrows. At seven knots slow speed, there was 20 minutes of current hurt on that one leg. And the scores showed it.

Winning first place overall was Bob Lindal and P/C Jeff Ewell on *Suzy Q* with 1.4691%. Ron Larson, competing as the second racer on *General Quarters* was second with an error of 1.6585%. POYC's Fred Cole aboard *Mousetrap* took third place overall with 1.8443%. The Team Trophy was awarded to Bremerton Yacht Club.

#### POULSBO YC – LIBERTY BAY CHALLENGE

A pleasant day with 10 kn south winds and a long 19 nm course with five scored legs made for a simple race, and the scores showed it, despite two transits of the "toilet bowl" shaped entrance to Liberty Bay. The course started at the marina and went down to Pt White and back. There was a weak predicted flood. 12 racers competed.

The race had three Five Hundred Club winners. John and Ellen Murphey of MBYC on *Sturdy Gal* won with 0.2403%. Jim Korzetz from PYC and P/C Dick Timmerman on *Freedom* were second with 0.2619%, only two seconds back. POYC's Fred Cole on *Mousetrap* was third with 0.3283%.

Ken Klett and P/C Dean Lengtis on *Klettitat* were fourth overall and first in class 3 at 0.5747%. Second in class 3 and fifth overall were Bob and Sue Lindal on *Suzy Q* with 0.6356%. Sixth overall and third in class 3 were Dave Padgett and Andy Gerde on *Slipaway* with 0.6661%. First in class 2 and seventh overall were Bill and Trish Anderson on *The Tillie* with 0.7123%.

Ken and Dean, Bob and Sue, Dave and Andy along with Bill and Trish combined to win the Team Trophy for QCYC.

"Truth Like the Sun" is the selection for the next gathering of the Bowl and a Roll Book Club at 6:30 PM June 26.







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
