
Member Photographs Tell the Story







CPR & First Aid Training Provides Advice, Direction, Dos & Don'ts

We had a strong turnout for the April CPR & First Aid session on Mainstation's 3rd deck. More sessions may be offered in the Fall due to interest. Participants practiced CPR and AED skills on manikins, with demos and Q&A. Heart disease and stroke are leading causes of death and disability. Call 911 for suspected heart attack or stroke—EMS speeds up treatment. Time matters!

CPR improves resuscitation odds by oxygenating the heart and brain. King County's bystander CPR drives strong

outcomes. Untrained? 911 dispatchers can guide you. Find QCYC's five AEDs on Docks 1, 2, 3, Mainstation, and Outstation. See American Red Cross AED instructions (redcross.org/take-a-class/aed/using-an-aed/aed-steps) for guidance.

Members learned water rescue via an Army Corps video: Reach, Throw, Row, but Don't Go! ([youtube.com/watch?v=WyoKvHEEFQI](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WyoKvHEEFQI)). Check first aid kits on your boat, home, and car for expired items. Consider a \$60 Airlift Northwest membership (uwmedicine.org/airliftnw/membership) (UW Medicine) for air ambulance cost coverage if you have medical insurance. Preparation is key for emergencies! 🚤
