INSURANCE COMMITTEE

MAINSTATION MOORAGE ELECTRICITY PROTOCOL PREVENTS **CLAIMS**

The insurance committee recently convened to review the club's insurance policies. We want to maintain that favorable pricing and rely on all members to help when it comes to loss prevention.

One of the primary (and preventable) causes of claims relates to our use of shore power cords

and connections. While a quick YouTube search can provide all the details, the number one rule when connecting to shore power is to turn off all systems prior to plugin. This includes not just the systems on your boat, but also the breaker on the power pedestal. Once you are plugged in, turn the power on at the pedestal and then on your vessel. Failure to follow this procedure damages the connections and can lead to long term damage resulting in arching, heat, and eventually fire.

The committee looked at amounts of coverage, scope of coverage and costs associated with the programs. As you might imagine, given the size and scope of

the general members - repairing, maintaining and operating the club demonstrate our pride of ownership. As we review the costs associated with insurance, we were pleased to discover that the underwriters agree and have provided us favorable pricing because of our excellent claim's history.

On the docks and around the club keep an eye out for maintenance or other issues that might lead to a claim. When you see something, please notify the office so they might take appropriate action. Common loss control items for Yacht Clubs include maintenance with: lighting, storage facilities, gates and security fences, exit signage and traction on ramps. While ours always seem to be in good condition, working together we will keep it this way.

It's a good time for the annual inspection and battery change of your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. All portable fire extinguishers should also be checked and replaced as needed. The end of the year is a great time to get this done.

Working together we can continue to keep the club shipshape, preventing claims and helping with the costs of insurance. We thank everyone for their effort now and in the future. The Insurance Committee is comprised of Captains Jim Ammons, Barry Rutten, PC Dean Lentgis, PC Bill McGillin, Gary Stone and chaired by Captain Trevor Campbell.




