BAINBRIDGE UPGRADES & PEANUT BUTTER COOKIES, PLEASE.

Rear Commodore's Report SECURE YOUR BOATS — REPORT ALL THEFTS TO SPD

Recently there have been several thefts of Yeti brand coolers from boats. In October I met with Officer Brian Blasé, our contact with the Seattle Police Community Team. He emphasized the importance that all crimes, even relatively small ones, be reported in order to collect data to establish patterns and problem areas to patrol.

When you discover a theft or damage to your boat or vehicle, call 911 and ask for a non emergency operator. Script can be simply "I want to report a non-emergency theft.....", etc.

There is an East Precinct burglary/
theft non-emergency number if you
want to call directly, 206-684-5740.
One can also go to seattle gov and
click on "Report a crime online."
There are some restrictions about the
type of crimes that can be reported
online which are explained on the
web site.




