Super Bowl Sunday, February 12, No-Host party on the 2nd deck with kick-off at 3:30 pm. BYOB and a snack to share.



HIGH TIDE WATER KING TIDE FLOODS OUTSTATION DOCKS

Heavy rains and a king tide brought flooding to shoreside areas in Puget Sound in December, including high water at the QCYC outstation. King tides can occur once or twice a year and reach up to 13 feet in central Puget Sound coastal areas. Higher-than-normal tides usually happen during a new or full moon, when it's closest to the Earth and when it aligns with the sun, creating a stronger gravitational pull, according to NOAA. King tide predictions are based on the position of the Earth relative to the sun and moon. Other factors, such as heavy rains and ocean conditions, can influence the height of a tide as well. As sea levels rise due to climate change, NOAA expects king tides to cause flooding more often, says NOAA. NOAA catalogs king tides in the U.S. and other tide predictions for states and regions at tidesandcurrents.noaa.gov. The agency also publishes seasonal projections for high tides at oceanservice.noaa.gov/news/high-tide-bulletin.

We want to thank the community for its support of the Seattle Police Department Harbor Patrol Unit in 2022! Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we were able to repair Patrol 4 and refresh the department's supply of water rescue throw bags and life rings. In 2022, we purchased 57 throw bags and six life rings. These lifesaving devices will replace outdated equipment here at the Harbor station and on board our boats. Additionally, each precinct will receive 10 throw bags to be disseminated at the discretion of the precinct commanders. These devices will enable patrol officers to immediately intervene, keep themselves safe, and throw a lifeline to a drowning victim. New Standards for Recycling -NOT A WASTE OF TIME

Along with the recent changes in the recycling industry came higher standards for recyclables. Items that don't meet these standards are

worthless and harder to recycle.

Follow these tips to recycle right and keep recycling thriving: § Empty, Clean, and Dry. Clean out your recyclables and keep them dry. No food or liquids in recycling.

§ When in Doubt, Find Out. Put only recyclables that are accepted in your recycling cart.

Visit the "Where Does it Go?" tool (www.seattle.gov/utilities/yourservices/collection-and-disposal/where-does-it-go if you are unsure whether an item is recyclable.

§ Keep Bags Out. Do not put plastic bags or plastic wrap in the recycling cart, even if bundled. Keep materials loose in the cart and do not bag your recyclables.

§ Focus on the top 5 types of recyclables: 1. Paper - office, newspaper, & magazines; 2. Cardboard - paperboard & corrugated boxes; 3. Plastic - Bottles, Containers, & Tubs; 4. Glass - Bottles & Jars; and 5. Metal - Aluminum, tin & steel cans and scrap. Note: Plastic Bags and Wrap even if bundled Do Not Go in Recycle.

Tarettes Board Installation meeting which is in June may change, so I will announce the date after a decision has been made.




