Vice Commodore's Report

CLUB RULES REQUIRE CURRENT REGISTRATION & INSURANCE

If you are a member of Queen City Yacht Club and have a boat then you know the drill when it comes to insurance and registration. Current copies of each need to be provided to the Club. This article highlights that as of October 2022, 35% of the vessels were showing as non-compliance in the database. Yes, that is right. More than 1/3. That is not ok.

After two months of chasing, we are now at 10% noncompliant. That is better, but it is still not ok. We are in this together folks. If one of your close cruising buddies is noncompliant, please lean on them with me. If you submitted the document, but it was not posted, then follow-up with the QCYC Office as all submissions have been processed.

CURRENT STATUS: QCYC makes monitoring compliance very simple. If you want to know what your documentation status is at any time, visit: Moorage / Vessel Qualification Overview. In fact, you can see it for all boats.

WHAT TO PROVIDE: Provide a copy of the current Washington State registration for your vessel and any associated tender that requires registration. Provide a certificate of insurance with: Minimum limit of

\$500,000 of liability coverage, Pollution liability coverage, AND Queen City Yacht Club names as "ADDITIONAL INSURED".

WHERE TO SEND IT: Email to office@queencity.org. or deliver copies to the office.

MORE INFORMATION: Rule 1.06 - Members shall provide the Club with evidence of a current, in-force boat liability

insurance policy and current Washington registration.

There are a couple of reasons that these expectations are set out in the rules. The provision of the registration documents accomplishes several purposes. A key purpose is that it ensures QCYC vessels do not include commercial vessels or fractional ownership vessels. The Club also wants to see compliant boats flying the burgee. Proof of insurance requires no explanation – both in terms of the amount and that QCYC be named as an additional insured. One additional fun fact is that QCYC, as a moorage facility operator, must require, as a condition of moorage, all vessels other than transient vessels to provide proof of marine insurance to the moorage facility. (See RCW 53.08.480).

We have plenty to do managing the Club. If you are in the 10%, please take care of your paperwork. Chasing is a poor use of limited, volunteer resources.



DO NOT CONTAMINATE THE CLUB'S RECYCLING CONTAINER

As an environmental studies major and anonymous dumpster diver, I found the club's recycling container to essentially contain much nonrecyclable garbage. I have found a flatscreen TV, aluminum pans from the galley dripping with food, and many other nonrecyclable items.

Contents of the recycle container go to a processing center where nonrecyclable items are removed from a conveyor belt, an expensive and labor-intensive process.

Examples of recyclable items include flattened cardboard boxes, clean glass jars and bottles (no broken glass), clean aluminum cans and foil, bagged plastic bags (i.e., no individual plastic bags), juice and broth boxes, paper including newspapers, magazines, and paperback books, clean milk and ice cream carton, coffee cups, and lids and caps greater than 3" diameter.

Prescription vials are not allowed, nor are metal objects greater than 35 pounds. For

more information on recycling do's and don'ts, visit the King County website - www.kingcounty/solid-waste/garbage-recycling/recycling.

You can print out a handy pictorial guide that aids in determining what appropriately goes into the individual garbage, food waste, recycling, and hazardous waste streams. QCYC provides containers for the first three of those waste streams on Mainstation premises.




