### Display parking permits to prevent problems


As a reminder, restricted parking started April 27th and runs through September 15th at the QCYC Mainstation. During the restricted parking period:

Long-time member, Captain Al Reiche, a man with a great sense of humor who loved to share stories and socialize at club events with many, many

friends, crossed the bar for the last time on April 2nd. He was a log racing participant and navigated for several of our best racers in the 90's and early 2000's. He was a "character of characters" with a spirit of freedom and fun and much loved by friends and members.

Al was born and raised in Kelso of parents who had emigrated from Germany and owned a grocery store. Al and his older brother John were often expected to help in the store. Al was married twice but had good and affable relationships with each ex-wife after the divorces. Al had many close relationships over the years but none as close as with Jodie Russell, as they were a fixture at the club in the 2000's.

Al had many interesting jobs over the span of his career but his favorite and longest was with Central Gardening and Pet Supply selling pet food. Al loved animals of all sorts and he usually had a pet cat in his life.

In the 70's, Al was a member of Yarrow Bay YC and where several of now-members of QCYC were also members - Larrie Chmela, Bob Hillmann, Con Nelson, Ian Knocker, Bob Prestebak and Jeff Purvis – they developed life -long friendships. They were all moored at Salmon Bay Marina with many a cocktail party on one of their boats and cruised together many times! Eventually they all came over and joined QCYC in the 80s and early

Captain Reiche's first involvement with Queen City was in 1991 when Al's wife Loui joined our club (Al had joined MBYC so they could enjoy both clubs). Al loved to tell the story of how he was the first man to be a Tarette! Ever the social guy, Al and Loui enjoyed many a party at both clubs. One fun memory that keeps getting told among Al's friends is when five couples from our club plus Al's brother John and his wife, bare boat chartered three

boats in the British Virgin Islands. Al & Loui, Carl & Stephy Weiss and Bob and Marge Hillmann were on one boat; Lynn & Kathy Montgomery and Jerry & Laurie Zuvich were on a second boat and John and Catherine Reiche hosted friends on a third boat. Many a beautiful bay with Al's boat usually the cocktail hour boat and Al serving as host and bartender! Too many stories to relate here but we will undoubtedly hear some at a memorial service for Al (won't be scheduled until the Covid restrictions are

When Al and Loui divorced, Al joined Queen City in 1998 and Loui took the MBYC membership. Al was extremely involved and served on the Moorage Committee, Chaired a Friday Night Social, Chaired the Lighted Boat Parade, Bartender Committee & Assistant Bar Manager and was a terrific Fleet Captain in 2000 & 2001!

He and Carl Weiss made a formidable log racing team for 10 years in the 90s - Al was the Navigator. Carl remembers Al being a knowledgeable seaman and very good at identifying waypoints. One year they won the prestigious SYC's Centennial log race - Al was so excited that he insisted they go to our club and crash the JO Ball to make the big announcement!

Another great story is the time when Jodie made Al an outlandish German General's Uniform (looked like a Central American Dictator's dress uniform) and Al wore it the entire time of a 3 day weekend cruise to Winslow! He would go around and give commands to all in Deutsch - no one was able to identify, or understand Al except by his voice! He never missed a Friday lunch and always sat with his buddies at the rectangular table by the bar! They too have many fun memories!

He owned two boats while a member; the "Delica Sea", a 35' Bayliner and the "Hummel Hummel" a 43' King that Al had lived on the past few years.

He is remembered around the club as being fun loving, very caring especially towards
