An outboard motor from a dinghy was also reported missing by another member. Please take care to secure all property on your boats, lock them whenever possible, and be vigilant regarding persons you may see on the docks who do not belong.

During Non-Restricted Periods, Club Members may park two vehicles, including trailers, on the Clubhouse property. A Club burgee decal must be affixed to a member's car at all times. A restricted period parking permit placard is not required.

There are exceptions: the week prior

to Opening Day, and at times of other scheduled Club activities including General Meetings and Friday Lunch, only one vehicle per membership, including trailers, shall be parked on the Clubhouse property. A Club burgee decal must be affixed to a member's car at all times and a Restricted Period parking permit placard must be clearly visible.

Parking is allowed only in striped areas. Handicapped parking spaces are not intended for long term use.

As a rule of thumb, please be courteous during high volume parking demands and restrict your parking use to keep spaces available for other members.

EIGHT BELLS EULOGY

Laurence (Larry) Arthur Keeler 1945 - 2019



Well known and liked, Captain Larry Keeler, member number 199, slipped his moorage for the last time on July 27th at the age of 74. Larry is fondly and widely remembered at the club for his friendly and welcoming personality and for his willingness to volunteer hundreds of hours to make Queen City a better club.

His wife Jean has written a very loving eulogy: "Larry was born in Yakima on February 17, 1945. He and Linda were the second set of twins born to Edward and Dorothy Keeler. In 1950 the family moved to Kennewick where his dad worked as an engineer for the Bureau of Reclamation. In 1954 he was transferred back to Yakima.

Larry started 5th grade at Roosevelt Elementary, then attended Franklin Jr. High and Davis High School, graduating in 1963. He studied at Yakima Valley College until he was concerned about being drafted for Viet Nam, so he joined the Coast Guard in the spring of 1964. Following basic training in Alameda, CA and Radioman school in Groton, Connecticut, Larry was stationed at Grays Harbor Lighthouse in Westport, WA. His next assignment was Radioman on the USCG Cutter Winona, based in Port Angeles. Ocean Station November and going to Alaska in the 255 ft. cutter were grand adventures for a young man who loved being on water.

On September 24, 1966, he married the love of his life and high school classmate, Jean (Drumright). They were happily married for 53+ years as they raised three dear daughters, Julie, Jenna and Jacqueline.

Career

Larry's career goal was to be a teacher, so even with the challenge of a very young family of five, he earned his BA in Industrial Arts Education from Eastern Washington University in 1971.

After teaching in Moses Lake for two years, he taught in the Yakima School District for 30 years. Not one to be known just as "Old Mr. Keeler in Room 5," he taught in 10 schools, in a variety of positions, including 4th grade, 6th grade, elementary PE, Title One Reading, driver's education, and wood shop, followed by 17 years as the librarian at Franklin Middle School. During those years he achieved certification as Media Specialist and

a Master's Degree in Education. He retired from public education in 2001.

USCG Reserves

At age 39, he joined the USCG Reserves as a Coxswain. As a Reservist for 25 years, he spent one weekend each month plus 2 weeks during the summer helping maintain over 1,000 aids to navigation on the Columbia and Snake Rivers. Jean understood his big grin as he kissed her goodbye when he left for drill weekends, knowing he would be doing what he loved.....running boats. He also enjoyed many years of teaching Safe Boating Classes and doing Vessel Examinations as a member of the USCG Auxiliary.

Volunteering

Larry liked to "give back," which led to many years of volunteering for state parks. Blake Island was our favorite. Ranger Paul Ruppert encouraged us to keep coming back for many years to help manage the docks at this popular park. Although sometimes a challenge, the experiences were deeply satisfying. Larry and Jean also hosted at Fort Flagler and Mystery Bay.

Boating

Larry's love for the water started at a young agehe owned a boat before he was old enough for a driver's license. He rarely owned just one boat. He spent summers with family and friends cruising inland waters, Puget Sound, and coastal British Columbia. One of his proudest accomplishments was earning his 50 ton Captain's License, which opened more doors, including working as Captain of tour boats at Crater Lake National Park and the Duck Boat tours in Seattle.

Faith

His quiet faith in God was strong. He joined Bible studies and read the Bible cover to cover several times, striving to develop a deeper understanding of spirituality. As a youth and adult, he loved to sing in church choirs.

Family

Family came first. Always involved in his children's and grandchildren's activities, he frequently initiated adventures related to their interests. Larry was present for them.....school concerts, swim meets, track meets, ski bus chaperone, President of Band Boosters, building furniture for dorm room.... you name it.... Larry was there supporting their endeavors and cheering them on!

Larry worked as Camp Administrator at First Presbyterian's Camp Ghormley for two summers, much to the delight of his children, who loved living in the forest.

He adored his family!

When his mother moved to Living Care, he accepted the job of shuttle driver for the retirement home. He spent a few years driving the residents to their destinations via unexpected scenic routes. He would tell them, "Sometimes the longer route is faster." Of course Jean bought him a shirt that says "Those who wander are not always lost."

Music brought harmony to his soul. He sang in

the Aeolian Choir at Davis, the YVC Singers, First Presbyterian Church Choir, and the Carriage Manor Chapel Choir in his winter home. As a longtime member of the Yakima Symphony Chorus, he performed in many local concerts, as well as China, Prague, and Vienna. In addition, he and Jean enjoyed attending musical events. When his girls were young, he frequently played the organ to lull them to sleep. During his last weeks of illness, he was comforted with choral music by great composers.

Hobbies

His hobbies included, you guessed it, boating, as well as woodworking, ham radio, biking, fishing, and tinkering. Exceptionally creative, he could fix anything with whatever he had on hand.

Larry and Jean led an active life including hiking, biking, camping, water sports with their children, world travels, boating in Canada, Mexico, England, and Ireland. They enjoyed the last several winters in Mesa, Arizona exploring the natural wonders of the Southwest and enjoying activities with friends at Carriage Manor Resort.

Larry's adventurous spirit, always looking over the next horizon, inspired us all. He was always sunny with a smile and a twinkle in his eye. A quiet, thoughtful, warm, gentle soul, his children will always call him their Superhero.

Boating:

Larry was a long time member of Yakima Valley Boat Club and enjoyed serving in several positions, including Commodore.

Larry and Jean moored boats in Seattle, so in 1999, Larry's Uncle Paul Thomas encouraged and sponsored him to join Queen City Yacht Club in Seattle. Being members for 20 years was a great experience as we made friends and explored interesting ports of call. "

The Keelers were active members and volunteers at QCYC. Larry volunteered to run the Opening Day shuttle for years and was Chair one year, were often Bainbridge outstation hosts in the summer, took special people on the Seafair Christmas cruise every year, always worked on the Pride of Queen City cleanup event and helped on innumerable events and dinners.

While members, the Keeler's owned three boats: the "Grandy Vent" a 28' Grandy, the "Happiness II" a 26' Bayliner and their favorite the "Columbia" a 33' Carver.


Larry will be very missed by members of Queen City.
