

So, when is the last time you took a good look at the QCYC website? The website is a resource that manages a large amount of traffic given the size of the membership. This is a testament to its utility. It continues to evolve and improve. The next time you are there, look around a bit and I'll bet you will find some resources that you were not aware of.

The high traffic areas of the website are the club calendar, the annual, and club moorage. These are great sources of information about QCYC activities, its members, and moorage information. The information is easily accessible from any browser, including your phone.

For the QCYC calendar, each event is linked to additional information simply by clicking on the hyperlinked event title. For those events that require registration, members can register directly from the calendar function with a couple of simple clicks. Registration is a tremendous help for event planners. If you are looking for contact information for another member, it is simple to find it through a search of their name or vessel under the "Annual" heading. Similarly, waitlist and assignment information is readily available under the

"Moorage" heading. You can also find information about your vessel's registration, insurance, and electrical testing status.

I expect you already knew this. However, if you browse a bit more, you will likely find some information that you were not aware of. For example, look under the "Facilities" heading. There is a bunch of information about bar operations. There is information

about how to become a bartender, the watchbill, bar orders, and more. There is also access to Club webcams at Bainbridge Island and the Main Station. Under the "Regulations" heading, you will find the By-Laws and QCYC Rules. While the rules may not be a great read from front to back, the governance documents are a good source of information to address questions members have related to membership, governance, moorage, parking, etc.

The ability of members to register for a night at the Bainbridge outstation, sign up for use of a workslip or moorage in the "U," register for an event, or basically just figure out what is going on at QCYC is the result of many members working in coordination. On behalf of all QCYC members, I want to thank those who keep the content and functionality of the website up to date.

So, consider this. If you have a question, like "What is my vessel status?", "How do I register for an event?", "How do I get my boat tested by VESC?", or "Who owns that beautiful Tolly, Monarch?", please consult the website before contacting the office or the committee chair. The answer is probably already there.



Mainstation security alert

Club security remains a top priority for the Bridge, including recent tips to members about securing cars and boats. Dock access is equally important. QCYC members are not allowed to lend their access cards to non-members. Your access card identifies you as a member and lets the Club know it is the member who is accessing parts of the premises. When a member lends a card, that connection is lost and the Club now does not know who is really on the docks and the rest of our property including Bainbridge Island, clubhouses, laundry room and Cummings Hall.

More importantly, that access card allows members access to all areas on Club grounds 24/7 (except the main station clubhouse where access is 0500-2400 hrs). Lending a card to a non-member, including vendors, allows them to gain unauthorized entry during those times.

Recently, the Security team has seen vendors access our clubhouse in the evenings and on weekends. One vendor had received the card from another vendor. This is not acceptable. These vendors have had the cards confiscated and the members have been warned about lending the cards. Lending an access card can lead to losing the privilege of that card, or can lead to further discipline by the Club for repeated violations.

In short, please refer to the following:

- 1. Do not lend access cards to vendors or other non-members;
- 2. You are responsible as a member to make sure your vendor registers with the office and receives a vendor card during week day hours;
- 3. When a vendor or non-member needs access in the evenings during the week or at any time during the weekend, the member MUST accompany that person and provide access.

Failure to follow these procedures puts all members' property and Club property at risk.







This being my inaugural article as a Bridge officer, I wanted to start out by stating how honored I am to serve you and this remarkable yacht club.




