

The South Sound Cruise - South Pacific saw many people stepping up to assist with my one man show which became one of many fleet





New Commodore, new club fiscal year! dropped off at the office.

Billing statements are emailed on the first of each quarter (October, January, April, and July) The first of October brings in a new fiscal year and will include your annual dues, and any other charges.

All members are emailed quarterly billing statements whether or not any charges are due. The administrative office asks that every member ensure their email addresses contained with the Club's website are up to date so statements are directed properly. Billing statements are sent out promptly on the first of each quarter. If that is unsuccessful, please email the office at office@ queencity.org.

Payment for statements are due by the end of the calendar month or 30 days -- or \$50 late fee.Payments may be made to the Board of Trustees:

By personal check which can be mailed or

- By personal credit card, email Elise Ochs the Office Manager to request an invoice to be sent online that you can pay at your convenience. There is a 2% charge for payments of this nature. Personal credit card information provided within emails are not accepted.
- By using the Automated Clearing House (ACH) payment program where payments are made electronically from your bank account on a regular basis. This payment is encouraged and can save headaches!
- The ACH program has no processing fees.
  - Payments are automatically deducted for the full amount noted on the quarterly statement from your designated bank account on or around the 25th of each billing period. Where the 25th falls on a

- weekend or holiday, payments are deducted on the following business day.
- This allows for almost a full month to dispute any charges or request a statement if you cannot find your invoice.
- No dollars are deducted from your account where there is a zero balance on your statement.
- Payments in advance may be made using an alternative payment method (e.g., personal check or credit cards) if the desire is to use a different bank account other than that which is on file.

There is a form to complete for the ACH program, contact Elise at the office and she will be happy to send it to you and respond to any questions.
