# VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

#### **WEBSITE**

Our web team sent out requests for proposals to redevelop our website to three web developers. We received two responses. After reviewing the responses by the team and an onsite meeting with one of the potential developers, a selection was made. This recommendation was presented to the board at their May meeting and approved. As of this writing we are finalizing a contract with them. Work on the new site should begin by mid June with a target of the late summer for implementation. Also the results of the member web survey were reviewed. The majority of the recommendations had to do with the content not being up to date. The second most mentioned topic was new functionality dealing with event registration and payment options available on line. The third topic information about our events was desired. We hope to address all these issue in a phased approach. The first task of the development will be to bring the background content management system up to date with the latest version. This will then allow us to proceed with future improvements. Thank you for your continued support.



in a timely manner if a problem is identified. Also in the event of an emergency responders need to know what they may be dealing with, gas, diesel or propane as an example. Without this information response may be delayed. Think of a boat fire as an example and how it would be handled.

Currently we have noticed that some of the placards may be damaged and in need of replacement. Please notify the Docks Committee if you need a replacement holder. If the information on the worksheet is missing or out of date it is your responsibility to contact the office to complete a new sheet. The office will type up the information and laminate. You can pick it up or I will deliver it to your slip for placement. If you are moored in a slip without a location for a holder please complete the form, have it laminated by the office and hang it inside your vessel window in a location easily seen from the dock. This is what I have to do at my current slip. This process is part of our Marina Best Practices Policy and in everyone's best interest to safeguard your vessel and our club assets.

#### **VESSEL REGISTRATION**

This is just a reminder that the time for annual vessel registration is upon us. Vessel registration

must be updated by the end of June with the new decal affixed to the boat. Loss of moorage privileges can result from lack of proper registration (Rule 3.08.07).
