This list is just some of the activities we are planning, so join in, contribute and have fun with the QCYC Tarettes this year! I look forward to seeing you this year!











Captain Don Perkins

1930-2021

LIFE MEMBER DON PERKINS #18 **TOOK HIS LAST OUTBOUND VOYAGE**

Captain Don Perkins took his last outbound voyage on July 15th of this year. Don was 91 years old when he passed and was Life member #18.

As a Seattle native, Don graduated from Roosevelt High School in 1948 and attended the University of Washington. At the end of his third year he received an offer from Stanford Law School and accepted. He graduated in 1954 and was then called up for active duty in the Army at the end of the Korean War.

Don grew up boating with his parents in the 1940s on their boat the "Eveldon" when his Dad, Sam

Perkins, joined QCYC in 1947. The family made many trips up to Princess Louisa Inlet and Chatterbox Falls, but in 1948 the Eveldon plus 3 was the only disturbance at the head of the inlet.

Don & Virginia were married in 1972 after meeting through mutual friends on South Pender Island in BC. It was the beginning of a wonderful almost-50 year marriage! After a 31 year career with the IRS Estates Tax Division, Don retired in 1986. He and Virginia enjoyed cruises, skiing, symphonies, and Mariners games. He was a lifelong Husky fan. In 1999 he and Virginia moved to Lynden. A cerebral man, he was well read and took a special interest in history, geography, and geology. Books were always nearby.

Don joined QCYC in 1971and was a member of our club for 49 years. He and Virginia toured Puget Sound and the coastal waters of BC in their several boats for many years. Mel Whitlinger fondly remembers Don as a great friend and smart with an intellectual nature. The Whitlingers cruised with Don and Virginia up to the Broughtons, Bull Harbour and Alert Bay areas.

Doug O'Brien remembers Don as "a good man. He worked alongside of Jack Dahlquist for many years at the IRS. His Father was a fine man too".

Larry Downs also remembers him fondly and writes: "The first boat I recall that Don and Virginia had was the Gorgeous 42' Jensen called Ila I. She was powered by a 175HP Cummins Diesel. The bright work on that boat was stunning and always top notch. Their next boat was the 40' Transpacific Eagle named Springtide. Chuck Gould now has that boat. Don always had a smile that would light up the room!"

During their membership, Don and Virginia owned the "Ila I", built at the Jensen shipyard in Friday Harbor, and the "Springtide", both noted above by Larry.

Don will be missed by all that knew him. He is survived by his dear wife Virginia of Lynden, sister-in-law Valerie of Ontario, Canada, and numerous cousins in Lynden, Bellingham, and Eastern Washington.

The VESC is dedicated to make the main station marina and our outstation marina in Eagle Harbor the safest electrical places for our members and visitors. The general membership has responded enthusiastically in support of our efforts.

A required satisfactory vessel electrical inspection is valid for a year. If your last inspection is overdue, your qualifications for moorage assignment will be compromised. Therefore, it is imperative that you schedule an electrical inspection on the following dates, September 11, 26 or October 9, 23, on the QCYC calendar, similar to signing up to a QCYC event.
